What is Independence Inn?

Independence Inn is open 7 days a week, 24 hours a day serving youth 16-20 years old. The Inn helps residents acquire life skills needed for independent living; career skills that will sustain independent and productive lives; and education that will support career goals.

Our program establishes schedules and routines that teach responsibility and order — promoting good habits.

The youth that come to the Inn are dealing with a variety of personal and family issues. The Inn provides comprehensive assessment and service planning to successfully transition the young people served to a stable, self-sustaining living situation upon completion of the program.

The Referral Process

Priority will be given to youth who are referred to the Independence Inn Program through a Department of Youth and Community Development (DYCD) crisis shelter.

Our Services

- Housing assistance and referrals to permanent housing prior to discharge
- Educational services, including basic skills testing and proficiency exams
- Long-term counseling for individuals and groups
- Independent living and life skills training
- Employment skills training
- Employment preparation and training
- Medical, mental health, and dental care
- HIV testing and education
- Legal assistance
- Recreational activities
- Substance abuse education and prevention
- Violence intervention and prevention education
- Parenting skills training
- Entitlement services
- Transportation to off-site programs and services
