Learning to Work Internship Program

How Internships Work

All students who are interested in Internships:

- Receive in-depth job readiness and career exploration training.
- Take part in a weekly group seminar to discuss their work issues and progress.

There is No Financial Cost to the Employers!

The Learning to Work program:

- Pays each student a stipend for their working hours.
- Provides regular staff follow-ups to ensure progress, offer advice, and help to resolve any workplace issues.

Purpose of EBCHS Learning to Work

- Expand students' knowledge of career options
- Learn how to use their current educational, employment, and internship activities as building blocks for achieving long-term goals
- Develop work readiness skills
- Improve educational achievement
- Assist students in communicating with peers and the larger community

What to Expect

What employers can expect from interns (students):

- Flexibility and an open mind
- Friendly attitude
- Willingness/commitment to learn
- 3-month commitment
- 5-15 hrs/wk (depending on site)
- Good academic standing
- Good school attendance

What interns (students) can expect from employers:

- A real work, hands-on experience
- A supportive work environment
- Open dialogue
- Training and regular supervision
- Clear expectations

Interns are available to work a variety of shifts depending on students' schedules and employers' needs.


