Getting Young Children Off to a Good Start

SCO helps parents and children develop strong bonds that ensure healthy physical, social and cognitive development. We provide a continuum of early childhood programming that begins at pregnancy and extends through a child's first four years to help parents foster literacy, healthy development and learning. We work with families to ensure that children enter school prepared to excel and build a bridge to their school and community.

SCO's Early Childhood Programs

- **Family Child Care Networks:** Our networks of in-home child care providers offer families with infants, toddlers and preschoolers a full day, year-round program that fosters healthy development and learning. As children age, they are able to transition into our Early Childhood Centers.
- **Early Childhood Centers:** We foster children's cognitive, physical, social and emotional development in three center-based programs in Bedford Stuyvesant/Ocean Hill, Brownsville and East Elmhurst/Corona. Our centers offer a year-round full day program that focuses on healthy development and preparing children for success in school.
- **Early Head Start:** We focus on healthy development and school readiness for infants and toddlers, offering high-quality, focused services and family engagement, either at home or in our Early Head Start Center.
- **Nurse-Family Partnership:** We offer this nationally recognized, evidence-based program that provides registered nurses who make home visits to expectant mothers offering the counseling and support needed to deliver a healthy baby and excel at parenting.
- **The Parent-Child Home Program:** This early literacy, school readiness and parenting program encourages verbal interaction and stresses the idea that playing is learning for children. Trained SCO personnel make home visits twice weekly, modeling reading and playing techniques with parents that prepare the child for school success.
- **Baby & Me:** Our parent and child playgroups foster healthy attachments between young children and their parents in a supportive social environment. Trained group facilitators use play and discussion to connect parents with their children, deepen their understanding of their child's development, feel more confident as parents and build a network of support with other parents in the group.
