### What is the Brooklyn Drop-In Center?

Located in Brownsville, the Brooklyn Drop-In Center (BDIC) provides a wide array of services to at-risk, runaway and homeless youth throughout the borough of Brooklyn. We treat all youth and their families with dignity, respect, privacy, and utmost confidentiality. **ALL SERVICES ARE FREE. NO APPOINTMENT NECESSARY.**

Our highly trained staff meet with youth to identify the issues they are facing and the scope of services needed. When appropriate, staff and the client work together to create an individualized service plan that outlines youth and/or family goals and provides resources to ensure that they achieve these goals. BDIC staff provide crisis intervention, counseling and mediation and encourage clients to participate in life skills, work readiness assistance, and educational counseling. We also provide referrals to other services, including education, career development, housing, mental health and substance abuse treatment programs.

We service youth 14-24 years old. If a client identifies as runaway or homeless, he or she is encouraged to participate in family mediation conferences, if appropriate. If family mediation/reunification is not an option, case managers work with the NYC Department of Youth and Community Development (DYCD) to explore alternative housing options.
